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A fresh breeze from the Atlantic is whispering through the Signature Suites of the Fishermen's Village

The "Village des Pêcheurs" is a charming cluster of suites overlooking a small lake, designed by Yves Collet to evoke the famous huts on stilts of nearby Arcachon Bay. In this "Fishermen's Village", a second group of suites is accessible via a passage on stilts, lined with century-old poplars, that stretches above verdant outcrops typical of the Atlantic dunes. The "44 Hectares" suite stands out, thanks to its covering of distinctive red wood salvaged from historic Canadian barns by Bordeaux Bois Anciens. Here, visitors experience an instant deep dive into the calming ambiance of the Atlantic coast.





Inside, the blanched-wood panelling is just one element of a decoration scheme, created by Alice Tourbier and Giovanna de Bosredon of Studio Auguri, that features natural materials offset by touches of colour. The curtains in heavy linen and the deep-pile natural rugs harmonise with the painted woodwork, polished concrete and striped cushions. Each Signature Suite is unique, with items of vintage furniture ferreted out by Alice Tourbier and Giovanna de Bosredon and artworks by Amelie, Maison d'Art, all carefully chosen to evoke Cap Ferret's most typical locations. Every bedroom tells its own story.

So, the pastel blue in the "Le Banc d'Arguin" Signature Suite effortlessly calls to mind the pretty shades of the sea in this mythic location where the Atlantic Ocean meets the waters of Arcachon Bay. The headboard in exquisite Dedar fabric matches the Nobilis cushions in various shades of blue. And the rattan, bamboo and cane furniture and Elitis raffia wallpaper intensify the feeling of inhabiting a luxury Atlantic cabin.

The "44 Hectares" Signature Suite is an invitation to stroll through the pine forest. Natural wood and dark green evoke those trees, so symbolic of this coastal region, and nod to the popular village of Cap-Ferret at the heart of the pine forest.
